The dawning of World Peace Day 2014 was marked by Yoga enthusiasts who gathered at sunrise at Bondi Beach to salute the sun for peace.

Later a group led by Olympic gold medallist Sally Pearson, in association with 'Bridge Climb' scaled the Harbour Bridge to sound the Peace bells at noon.

Solemn High mass for Peace was held in St Mary's Cathedral followed by the release of white doves in the lower forecourt and the pealing of church bells.

Lindfield Uniting Church

This is a paraphrase of a report by Malcolm Allerding of the Interfaith Service at the Lindfield Uniting Church (LUC) celebrating the UN International Day of Peace.

Yes, in some parts of the world there is a level of peace, but in far too many other parts there is way too much 'not peace'. Lindfield Uniting Church at least hopefully encouraged an increase in peace amongst the 100 people who attended the Interfaith Peace Service, at 12 noon on Sunday 21 September, the United Nations International Day of Peace. The UN Secretary General Ban Ki-moon puts it this way, 'Peace is one of humanity's most precious needs'. Or in the words of Mother Teresa, 'Let peace fill our hearts, our world and our universe'.

Our prayers came from a mix of different people groups – Aboriginal, Baha'i, Buddhist, Catholic, Hindu, Islam, Jewish, Sikh, Sufi, and Lindfield Uniting Church. We lit peace candles, watched white doves fly free, sang songs together and we listened to music.

There was an opening prayer by the Rev Neil Eriksson of the LUC, introductory remarks by Dr Daryl Le Cornu, UNAA(NSW) and a moving homily by Dr Fiona Scott of the Baha'i faith.
